Use of Pupil Premium 2013-2014

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. This will also include pupils eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years (known as the Ever 6 FSM measure).

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit. However we will be held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to support pupils from low income families. From September 2012, we are required to publish online information about how we have used the Premium. This will ensure that parents are



information about how we have used the Premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the Premium and the extra support that they receive.

Our School

In 2013-14 (April to April)Long Ditton Infant and Nursery School received £18,900 for Pupil Premium for 18 pupils on the FSM register in school year 2012-13 and 15 children in school year 2013-14.

Below is a breakdown of the activities that children on the FSM register take part in to ensure they are making the maximum progress. The table also shows how we spent the money and where we supplemented the money to ensure all of needs of the children were met.
