The two aspects of worship and assembly are frequently inter-related and take into account the diversity of cultures and religions within our school. Our daily collective worship reflects our Values based ethos and is of a mainly Christian character.

SCHOOL ASSEMBLY

Our assemblies include an act of worship that reflects our Values. Our whole school understanding of this is that the act of worship is "***the occasion for exploring and affirming those matters of human worth which are at the heart of education and shared humanity.***" This is done by offering the opportunity for personal reflection and spiritual development. Each assembly will 'promote the spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development of pupils and of society' and aim to provide a focus for the whole life and activity of the school which includes celebrating children's work, school successes etc. We encourage visitors to our assemblies as their contributions increase awareness of our near community and our worldwide community.

The weekly themes are based on the value of the month and the Seal theme for the half term. Specific religious festivals, events and particular whole school issues are included as appropriate.

It is the principal aim that all children take part in our school assembly programme. However, any parent of any pupil may request that their child be wholly or partially excused from the collective worship.

VALUES

We are a Living values school. Each month we link and teach these Values within each area of the curriculum. Through our **SMSC provision (Spiritual, Moral, Social & Cultural)** we aim to enable pupils to develop their self-knowledge, self-esteem & self-confidence. Pupils will learn right from wrong and to respect other cultural differences.
