We have been so impressed with all the learning you have been doing from home and have loved being able to share in this with you via email and Tapestry. It has been wonderful to see you all making progress and as we move into a new half term we think you should all be very proud of yourselves for all your hard work. As next week is half term we will not be sending home the usual weekly home learning pack but rather some ideas for activities you could complete at home, detailed below. We do however, think it is important that you make sure you have some fun and enjoy the break.

Home Learning Ideas:

- Can you plant a seed and observe how it grows? How long does it take to sprout? Can you measure it and see how much it grows over the week? See Mrs McQullian's video on planting a seed on Tapestry.
- Using the story book cover recreations made by the teachers, can you make one of your own to share with us? Remember you can only use things you find around your homes, no premade costumes!

- See Mrs Paines' section of the newsletter for the whole school project to redesign the wooded area behind Reception. We can't wait to see all your ideas.
- Please do continue with short bursts of reading and phonics practice daily to ensure your child is practising their skills in this area.

Following half term, your children as well as yourselves will be experiencing yet more change. As a result, we thought that over half term it might be nice to look back on the excellent learning you have completed this half term. We would like you to take or choose two pictures of your learning or something you have achieved since the school's closed. Year 1

What a beautiful sunny week! We hope that you have enjoyed the sunshine as well as the home learning. Thank you for continuing to update us regarding the progress of your children at home. It has been lovely to receive the photos of the children hard at work and to be able to see what the children have been accomplishing at home. Thank you for your ongoing support.

Staff have been busy preparing for a return on 1st June, should the school reopen at this time. Mrs Paines will be providing the details regarding the reopening of the school. If your child is returning to school at this time, they will receive a 'Welcome' pack outlining important information for their return to school. In Maths this week the children have been solving division problems using the plate method and an empty number line. We have seen lots of photos of your hard work and resilience solving these tricky problems. Our focus in Literacy this week has been on diary writing. We have written our own diary entry in the character of the Big Bad Wolf.

Our exciting Topic learning has included using a rocket launcher to propel a mouse into the air and creating a fact file about an animal and its habitat using our own research. If possible, you will need some broad beans seeds for our future science learning.

Next week is Half Term and we hope you are able to have a relaxing time in the sunshine. After Half Term we are going to ask the children to reflect upon their time at Long Ditton Infants so far and to write down their memories. Our aim is to ask the children to video themselves talking about their memories and send them in to us via email. We would then like to put these videos onto a dvd to share as a celebration of Year 2 and their life at Long Ditton Infants. We have other ideas for our Year 2 Celebration that is in the planning stage at the moment.




